Paragraph	Main idea	Reason or example

(3)	The problem is that you're still hungry after drinking soft drinks, ...	That's because you don't feel full after drinking – although soft drinks contain a lot of calories. (reason)
(4)	American kids and teenagers are drinking more soft drinks than ever before, ...	Thirty years ago, for example, boys drank more than twice as much milk as soft drinks. (example)
(5)	Having or not having soda machines in schools changes how much soda teenagers drink.	If it's easy to buy soda, kids will drink more. (reason) In California, schools aren't allowed to sell soda any more. (example)

Lösungsbeispiel

I don't think soft drinks should be sold in German schools because they're unhealthy. They contain a lot of calories. For example, if you drink a cola, you take in 400 calories. But you're still hungry. So schools should sell healthier drinks like water, milk, tea etc. If schools offer these drinks, students will buy them. / I think it's okay for German schools to sell soft drinks. Everybody can decide himself/herself what to drink and how many calories to take in. If you want to learn, you need calories. So students should have the chance to buy the drinks they want.
